ABOUT COLLEGE

Founded in 1851 by charter of the Missouri legislature, and then named Christian Female College, Columbia College assumed its current name and became coeducational in 1970. Although it retains a covenant with the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), Columbia College is a nonsectarian institution.

The College is fully accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools and holds specialized accreditation in its Education, Nursing, and Social Work programs. Students may enroll in either day or evening classes at the home campus in Columbia, Missouri, or in its Extended Studies Division at one of many sites around the country.

ADMISSIONS

Students may be admitted to a site of Columbia College upon presentation of any one of the following: (1) high school diploma, (2) successful completion of the high school General Educational Development Test (GED), (3) evidence of satisfactory college work. Potential students who lack a requirement for admission may be considered on an individual basis. Individuals so considered must give evidence that they

DROP POLICY

A student may drop a class and receive full reduction of tuition and course charges prior to the end of the first week of the session. The student must fill out a Drop/Add/Withdrawal form prior to the close of business (5:30 p.m.) on Monday of the second week of class.

WITHDRAWAL POLICY

A student may withdraw from a course(s) after the drop/add period and prior to the end of the sixth week of a session (weeks 2 through 6) and no punitive grade will be issued **PROVIDED** a Drop/Add/Withdrawal is received by the director or director-designated representative not later than Friday of the sixth week of a session.

PAYMENT POLICY

Tuition costs are \$130.00 per credit hour. Lab fees for computer classes are \$20.00. One half of tuition costs are due at the time of registration unless financial aid or other arrangements have been previously made. A student's account must be paid in full prior to registering for a new session. Refunds will be issued upon request for classes dropped within the first week of the session.
